



## Black Spruce Exploration President & CEO clarifies remarks

St. John's, Newfoundland – April 10, 2013 (11:00 p.m.) – In a speech delivered to the Greater Corner Brook Board of Trade earlier today, I quoted information from the Canadian Association of Petroleum Producers (“CAPP”); however, I was not specific enough in my remarks.

What I said was, “There are over 200,000 hydraulically fractured wells in Canada and not one case of groundwater contamination from stimulation fluid.” My remarks should have been more specific, stating that, “There are over 200,000 hydraulically fractured wells in Canada and not one case of drinking water contamination from stimulation fluid.”

In the interest of full disclosure, there has been one reported case of contamination to groundwater sources in Grande Prairie, Alberta. I trust that our swift action will demonstrate our commitment to act with integrity in clarifying these remarks.
